Health Care providers in Kansas serve a wide variety of historically marginalized individuals and populations. One of these sectors is best known as "Latinx" (gender-neutral or nonbinary alternative to Latina/Latino). Latinx populations in the US represent nearly one fifth of the total (18.5%) population.¹ In Kansas, Latinx people represent the 2nd largest population overall (12.2%),² while in some areas of Southwest Kansas such as Dodge City, Liberal, Ulysses, and Garden City, more than 50% of residents identify as Latinx³.

In this interactive session, we will take a closer look at the Latinx population through their stories and discussions of everyday challenges and realities. Interested participants are invited to join us to learn more about this population in Kansas in order to bridge cultural gaps and build a better place to live for all who call it home.
